Congratulations to all members for another outstanding season. Mudjimba SLSC has, over its second season, consolidated its membership and services on Mudjimba Beach. Every member can take pride in the Club's achievements this season and the very careful and important building process that must take place to achieve a solid foundation, both in membership and in bricks. Members must work together to achieve these goals.

At the Sunshine Coast Branch Annual Presentation Night on 16 May 1998 Mudjimba SLSC was awarded 3rd place in the *Buhks-Wilkes Trophy* and our Junior Club Captain, Craig Roberts, was awarded the *Paul Egan Memorial Shield*. Our big disappointment this season was our unsuccessful application to Jupiter's Casino Community Benefit Fund for funding for the storage facility. However, we have taken this in our stride and will continue in our efforts to access funding with the same determination and persistence that has brought the Club to its current level of achievements.

Disappointments aside, one of the high points of the seasons was our successful 'Needy Clubs' nomination and we thank *The Pelerman Group* for their sponsorship of our First Aid Room of \$10,000.

The observation/radio tower is presently under construction and should be completed by June 1998. It will be a welcome haven for patrolling members on those cold, rainy days when the service must be maintained. I'm sure the Radio Operators will miss the rickety chair and table under the arena shade, the sand in the radios, bags, lunches and wherever else it can find access.

For our Club to survive is a costly exercise and to date, we have managed for two seasons without any financial assistance from the Queensland Government. We could not have done so without financial assistance from our sponsors and the sterling effort put in by Erica Barron, our Social Co-ordinator. It is imperative to our survival that all members assist whenever and wherever they can in all fund raising activities.

Some 68 Awards were gained this season – an outstanding achievement for our members. Dedication and enthusiasm such as this improves the standards of our patrols and promotes membership to the Club.

I would like to thank the Management Committee for the hard work put in during the season. At times there were some difficult decisions to be made, and other problems that needed resolution with discretion and dignity. It was my pleasure to be a part of the team.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Over the season, as I drowned in paperwork and constantly shuffled through reports, memos, faxes and letters whilst having a telephone glued to each ear and cleaning bits of last night's dinner off the latest edict from Branch, it frequently occurred to me to ask myself why I was putting myself through all this. The answer to my often asked question came last night at the Sunshine Coast Branch Annual Dinner when our Junior Club Captain, Craig Roberts, took out the coveted *Paul Egan Memorial Shield* and Mudjimba SLSC came overall 3rd in the prestigious *Buhk-Wilkes Trophy*.

It also occurred to me that it would be nice to have a wall on which to hang these, preferably alongside the *Keenest Club Captain Award* gained by Mark Windsor last season.

The year has been one of fairly drastic changes as far as the position of Secretary in a surf club is concerned. Getting all 15 clubs in the Branch on-line with the Internet, E-mail and up-dating personal skills to use this technology to best advantage has been a fairly mammoth task, achieved on a minimum time scale. For Mudjimba, this transition was fairly painless with most of the equipment already in place (on loan), the exception being the programs needed to communicate through the system and here, Branch again came to our aid.

The Board of Planning and Administration was formed at the Sunshine Coast Branch during the season and I successfully nominated as a member. The knowledge gained at BOPA meetings is a valuable contribution to the better running of our Club.

Management meetings were well attended over the season and our thanks go to the *Mudjimba Progress Association* for the use of the Mudjimba Community Hall. The Club has during the season provided many opportunities for members to participate at conferences and seminars, intra and interstate. Michael Lawrance was successfully nominated to attend the 1997 State Leadership Development Camp at Point Lookout SLSC on North Stradbroke Island during August 1997. Mark Windsor attended the 1997 SLSA Lifesaver Conference at North Narrabeen in Sydney during November 1997 and Craig Roberts attended the Inaugural Youth Development Camp at Tallebudgera on the Gold Coast in December 1997. More recently Dorothy Heywood and myself attended a weekend computer course initiated by SLSQ in Brisbane.

Although our membership increased only marginally on last season in total numbers, the percentage of active and award members has increased dramatically. Some 60-65% of our total members are active and award members. Beach visitation figures have also increased with 26,561 people swimming and playing on Mudjimba Beach between September and April.

I can't close without saying a word about the number of patrol hours put in by members this season – over 1,000 hours up on last years figures which reflects the increase in the number of active and award members. Craig Roberts and Michael Lawrance obviously vie for the 'Get a Life' Award, however Karl Dittmer managed to amass 174 hours after only gaining his Bronze on 21 December 1997. Had Karl learned how to sign off in the patrol log, the figure would have been much higher.

I'd like to thank the many members who have assisted with various tasks, which has lessened the load for me, including the indomitable Sid Hillier, Rowan and Jan Stanley, Mick Coleman, Craig Roberts and Michael Lawrance. Special thanks to my husband, Steven Smith, for his culinary skills, to Ken O'Connell at Branch for his welcome advice, time and sexist jokes, and to Julie Clutterbuck at Branch for her timely warning that Sid was in the process of giving up smoking.

I look forward to next season and, following the construction of our storage facility, the conversion of my dining room to the purpose for which it was originally built.

TREASURER'S REPORT

It is pleasing to report a 15% increase in income for the year completed however, with expansion of our membership, training and equipment, our expenses have shown an accountable increase of 44%. Never the less, we completed the season showing \$13,258.28 of income over expense.

Donations for the season increased by \$10,000 on last season, brought about mainly by the grant from Maroochy Shire Council for the construction of the observation/radio tower. This money is still to be spent.

Fundraising for the season was disappointing. Members lack of support saw the closure of the Goose Club and the postponement of the Golf Day – a bitter blow for Erica Barron who has worked so hard for the Club.

Art Union ticket sales are showing a good return with \$1,464.00 recorded for the Season.

Early season fundraisers, the RNA and the Brisbane Doorknock, were well organised with a satisfactory return. More members need to get involved in this year's Doorknock to make it the major income earner for the year – more collectors mean more money for the Club.

Due to commitments at Marcoola SLSC this year, I have not been able to spend as much time as I would have liked at Mudjimba. However, I congratulate you all on a great season and extend my thanks to officers and members for the dedication shown by each and every one of you.

MUDJIMBA SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INCORPORATED NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 1998

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to provide accounts which satisfy the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Qld) to prepare accounts. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity as defined in Statement of Accounting Concepts 1 'Definition of the Reporting Entity' and therefore, as there is no requirement to apply accounting concepts or standards in the preparation and presentation of these statements, none have been adopted intentionally.

The Statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Qld). The statements are prepared on an accruals basis, from the records of the association. They are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or except where specifically stated, the current values of non-current assets.

The following specific policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been applied in the preparation of these statements.

(b) Property Plant and Equipment

All assets, including Buildings are depreciated over their useful lives. Items of Plant and Equipment costing less than \$300 are not added to the asset register but are expensed.

(c) Inventories

Inventories are measured at market value.

(d) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from Income Tax in accordance with Section 23(g) of the Australian Income Tax Assessment Act.



RADIO OFFICER'S REPORT

We ended this season still seated at a table in the arena. It was a much better plastic table (supplied by Jane) than the now three and a loose-legged card table we used from Day One. Delays in getting the tower were out of our hands and the BPA, MSC and Wik all played their part as the season went along. The construction of the new tower began just after the season finished with the spudding-in of four screw piles and the letting of the contract to fabricate the aluminium frame, so we will start the new season in splendid isolation up on the dune.

Our radio equipment is basically unchanged from last season and the HF 1-watt handheld sets being used on the beach, in the vehicle and the IRB survived with generally minor mishaps. The few days of bad reception I will blame on ionosphere disturbances and the effect of the prevailing wind blowing our feeble signals away from Sunshine Command. We had only one incident of a jammed PTT button caused by the IRB harness, but it was a first class performance as a huge audience were treated to a fascinating commentary of a scenic tour right round Mudjimba Island on a nice day. For the last few patrols a more powerful HF set provided to us on loan by Ryan Gaylard, a technician with Mooloolaba Radio & Services, gave much better reception and transmission as a base radio. The new tower will allow us to have a much better antenna and power supply, which should overcome most of our problems.

The Club policy of putting all Bronze Squad trainees through the Radio Operator's Certificate has been a great success so we now have a large number of ROC qualified lifesavers to supplement the small but dedicated band of associate operators. The inaugural operators who came back from last season, Erica Barron, Jane Langford and Gillian Smith, were joined as the year went on by Trish Lark, Michelle Hopwood, Dorothy Heywood and Kelly Lark and I am very grateful for their support and help during the season. Likewise the many patrol members who took over the base radio at times, often when the weather was bad, did a very good job and it was great to have such a competent back-up available.

With the tower as our base next season, I would like to drum up a larger band of operators so I ask all members to spread the word amongst the community. Qualifications are basically to turn up for patrols, remain awake during the patrol, be able to write short notes and use a phone. Everyone has my permission to promise anything, exaggerate the joys of service, offer bribes and inducements and do anything to introduce new members to our Club.

Thank you all for your support this past season and I look forward to seeing you on the beach next September.

This has made it difficult to keep it cleaned and maintained as it should be. The problem of keeping available to treat stinger victims was overcome with the purchase of a small esky and an 'ice' account at *Mudjimba News & General Store*.

With Surf Life Saving becoming an accredited service provider, the award for the First Aid Certificate now stands alongside the Red Cross and St Johns Ambulance Certificates. The interest shown by club members to do this course was promising. Unfortunately not all could be verv accommodated in the first course however the 6 selected all passed. Those who missed out this time should be able to do their award in the near future as all clubs are being encouraged to become more self-sufficient in training in this area. 
