PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mission Statement:

Mudjimba Surf Life Saving Club is strong in growth and committed to providing a safe and family oriented beach environment and to achieve our **Mission Statement** of

Mission achieved for the 2004/2005 season. Thanks to the huge efforts of our Patrol members and supporters. Our 75 patrolling bronze / radio operators completed a staggering 5163 patrol hours for the season, up 18% on last season. With a community growth of around 14% and a staggering increase in the beach visitations for the season, members can hold their heads up high for a job well done.

Support Services

Our club supplies more than half of the rostered members for the Wave Runner Patrol #16 and one member to the Noose Jet Boat Patrol. Throw in District Supervisor Steve Smith and it becomes very clear that the members at Mudjimba SLSC have, as our Club Captain often states, "the red and yellow flowing through them". For such a small club, with so few members, your commitment is well recognised at a Branch and State level.

Nippers

If you ever need a reality check as to why we work hard as members, just take the time on a Sunday morning in nipper season to watch what happens. The mums and dads turn up wiping sleep from their eyes, the kids likewise. Then like a well oiled machine, tents start going up, trailers get hooked up, boards get loaded. If you are then on patrol, mild panic sets in, as over a hundred nippers head towards the patrol area. Flags are set up for beach sports, swim cans are set out the back for swims. The kids are into it, magically, water safety people appear and for the next two hours, the kids have the best time of their week. This is the greatest buzz for me as a patrolling and committee member. Thanks to all associated with the nippers for giving my week that buzz. To Shawn and his committee, you are all a credit to the club and I certainly appreciate all your effort, thank you.

Equipment

We will be going into the 2005/2006 season with new IRB, 4WD and Rhino vehicles thanks to Lend Lease, Kirk Foundation and The Nine Network. Our training facilities and equipment are being upgraded thanks to a grant from the

NRMA group. All other patrol equipment is in very good condition and ready for next season.

Surf Sports

Our nippers continue to improve with every meeting, with our under 14 boys winning selection to compete in Mackay for the state titles in the beach relay. Unfortunately they had to pull out due to some of the members being unavailable. Sarah Windsor continues to shine in both Surf Lifesaving and Royal Lifesaving, winning selection for Australia in both.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in all material respect, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial report so as to present a view which is consistent of our understanding of the Club's financial position, and performance as represented by the results of its operations and its cash flows. These policies do not require the application of all Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Extent of Audit

Based on the records kept and the nature of the income, we cannot certify that all of the Club's income has been deposited for the credit of the Club, however we have no reason to believe otherwise.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporation Act 1981. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Queensland Associations Incorporation Act 1981 and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AAS 5: Materiality

AAS 8: Events Occurring after Balance Date

AAS 17: Accounting For Leases

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from Income Tax in accordance with Section 50 - 45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997

(b) Property, Plant & Equipment

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(c) Inventories

Inventories are measured at cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in, first-out basis.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE

This year we started with around 140 nippers across age groups, with good numbers in the U14's who have had an especially good season under the leadership of Michael Spring. This age group is very important to the nippers and the club as they provide us with plenty of water safety throughout the season and will progress through to cadets and bolster the numbers available for patrols.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank members of the Management Committee and patrol members of the club for the fantastic support to the nippers both financially and on our Sunday training days on the beach.

It is also appreciated that nippers are being recognized by the Management Committee as supporting the club rather than being a burden, with many nipper parents doing their SRC or Bronze Certificate and contributing to the finances of the club.

During the season there has been a hard working core group of people that spent many hours registering nippers for carnivals, running the day on the beach, organizing and attending carnivals and attending training courses and meetings, which are essential if we are to succeed in running nippers. I don't think all parents realize just how much time is required to run nippers and unfortunately we are going to need to spend more time ensuring that we provide a safe environment and that nippers is an enjoyable experience for our children.

We have already started planning for next season and the new JAC committee will be accepting 'applications for membership' from today. This will be a different system for signing on as we will do all the applications and paper work prior to doing the proficiencies. The proficiencies requirements have been increased for next season and they will be advertised so that applicants are able to train for the proficiencies.

It has been a little disappointing to have quite a number of nippers drop out very early after joining and quite a few not returning after the Christmas break. As no one notified us that they were dropping out, we have turned away potential members because we believed that the age group was full.

The JAC committee feels that we need to bolster the team spirit in each age group. Again, no one can not have noticed the dramatic increase in the U14's enthusiasm and camaraderie.

their own colour caps which will be given to the nipper when they sign on and handed back to the age manager when they sign off.

All nippers will be required to wear club swimmers while they are signed on, no board shorts will be allowed.

We are finishing the season well resourced with a very small wish list for the new season. The incoming committee will be able to fine tune the program for the next season and I ask that if all parents offer to do just one thing in the season it will be helpful in reducing the work load of the core few that do more than their fair share.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Kylie Hosking who has done a terrific job for the last three years but will not be nominating for a position next season. Also I would like to make special mention of those members that have the club as a second home! Maree Cross: registrar and patrols, Sue Geraghty: carnivals co coordinator and Greg Carson: team manager, coach and patrols.
