

2008 saw our club members both start and continue to enjoy some unique community partnerships. We monitored turtle nests with Coolum Coast Care (hatching a loggerheads first nest of babies just south of the boardwalk), participated in joint fundraising with the Lions Club, partnered with university students to develop sustainable practices though Ecosurf, shared our facilities with a local youth group and an Art group, supported the Charity Island swim and provided first aid for many local community events.

Our Gear and Equipment stocks have gone through a revival thanks to support from Sunshine Coast Branch and funds from various grants and sponsors to provide a much needed and long overdue new ATV, Defib and radios along with other essential items such as flags, warning signs, rashies, etc. Thank you for your generosity without which we could not provide the exceptional service level expected of us. Close of season came quickly and we are now eagerly anticipating the arrival and "test run" of our new Nambour RSL Arancia IRB.

The replacement and re-engineering of our trusty Beach Arena that has sheltered us from many a storm, is currently being designed and new boards are on the list for next season.

Often overlooked are the extra hours, in addition to patrols and committees, our club members give to provide support services to the Sunshine Coast. This season Mudjimba provided wave runner and jet boat crew, after hours call out teams, Surfcom operators and Duty Officers.

Radio Officer's Report

We started the season with six hand held two way radios. Another two were obtained from the Tru-Energy grant early in the season and two more were donated by Westpac in March, making a total of ten.

All radios are now being serviced by our radio technician in readiness for next season. Some of the radios are badly corroded due to ingress of sand and salt. Radios should be protected by plastic gloves wherever possible and kept out of the sand. Use of the plastic gloves and/or the radio harnesses will greatly reduce this corrosion.

A quote is being obtained to re-wire the radios in the Tower and install an improved battery charging system. This will ensure longer term reliability and improved battery charging capability. The siren and PA system was transferred to the new ATV at the start of the season. The unit has been serviced recently, so is ready for next season.

During the off season radios will be cycled through the large charging station to ensure long term battery life and radio availability for operations if needed. Only half the radios will be on charge at any time.

We have been able to install an efficient compressor arrangement (thanks Pete); conduct a significant amount of formal and informal training (thanks to Guy, Dean, Don & Kye); commission a new motor and obtain a sponsorship from Nambour RSL for a new Arancia 377 and sand trailer. With Dean Hore, Don Parry and Kye Burke soon to qualify as IRB trainers we are well placed to have a ducking great year in 2009/2010.

Our ducks have done significant rescues as well as provide countless hours of water safety to nipper training, bronze squad and the Champion Lifesaver carnival.

Better equipment, many new drivers and crewies and an enthusiastic core of members who are committed to the skill development necessary to drive these rescue craft in the most challenging of conditions.

All in all it has been an encouraging year for the ducks. Congratulations to all involved.

Note 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Fixed Assets

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(c) Leases

Leases of fixed assets where substantially all the risk and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership are transferred to the association are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments. Including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term.

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Lease incentives under operating leases are recognised as a liability and amortised on a straight-line basis over the life of the lease term
