- 5 Silver Medallion IRB Driver's
- 3 JRB Crewman Certificate
- 2 Assessor Advanced Resuscitation Certificate
- 1 Assessor IRB Drivers
- 1 Skills Assessor TAA Program
- 1 Training Officer Advanced Resuscitation Cert

We also had two international students who completed their Bronze Medallion this season – Carlos Sucha-Souza from Brazil and Tom Sinke from Germany. Both Carlos and Tom were very keen to become an "Aussie Life Saver" and once they achieved their award were enthusiastic in patrolling during the season. ### **Radio Officer's Report**

We started the season with ten hand held two way radios.

All radios were serviced by our radio technician in readiness for the season. Some of the radios are badly corroded due to ingress of sand and salt.

Radios should be protected by plastic gloves wherever possible and kept out of the sand. Use of the plastic gloves and/or the radio harnesses will greatly reduce this corrosion.

One hand held radio battery failed during the season, but has not been replaced as only five or six radios are normally used.

The Tower equipment had an improved battery charging system installed and new wiring. This will ensure longer term reliability and improved battery charging capability.

One of the tower fixed radios failed during the season, and has not been replaced. It was decided that one fixed radio and a hand held radio would be sufficient for operations.

I hope that next season we can work on advanced skills training for a core of drivers and crew who wish to be able to safely perform high surf rescues, whether that be over at the island or inside our break in big seas. *The ducks and wave runners are surf life saving's craft for remote and dangerous rescues.* We can always advance our skills in these challenging environments that the swimmers and board paddlers can't manage.

provide water safety to bronze squads, nippers and the island charity swim; as well as providing carnival support to the Marcoola Masters & Mudjimba Champion Lifesaver.

## **Ecosurf Report**

#### Note 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### (a) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### (b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

### (c) Impairment of Assets

At each reporting date, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

### (d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

#### (e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the company has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at reporting date.

#### (f) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

#### (g) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### (h) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

#### (i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.
