To all our members, short tall old and young, Mudjimba SLSC is built on your energy, spirit and enthusiasm. We are more than a club house and bricks and I salute the bravery each of you displayed this season. Bravery is overcoming personal fears to swim “out the back” proudly wearing our clubs colours at events and carnivals, mate ship on the beach, good sports in the nippers, helping the front line at the floods and showing up behind the scenes to get the job done. Thank you.

I personally am very much looking forward to some big dreams being started next year and sharing the life of the beach with you and the community we protect.

Lifesaving

I am pleased to report Mudjimba SLSC met our mission of "Zero Preventable Deaths between the Flags" – a performed 106 rescues and 1211 actions that prevented the need for a rescue at our beach.

This season our members provided 8,397.75 logged hours of volunteer service to the community and countless more in training and supporting our local area at events with first aid and volunteer workforces for activities such as Clean up Australia Day, Pacific Paradise Community Day, Island Swim and Coast care tree planting.

Our clubs level of proficiency amongst our members is once again a stand out with most active members holding more than three awards. Thank you to our CTOs and trainers who made this possible. Our Buhk Wilkes inspection results were on the whole outstanding demonstrating a high level of skill in our lifesavers across the whole membership. Dean, our Club Captain and your lifesaving committee, Gloria our supervisor, and your Assessors, Toni and Guy CTOs and your trainers, these results are a credit to your hard work.

Storage space is still an issue in the club house, made much better this season thanks to the skills of our members installing board racks and new systems. We are looking forward to the arrival of a new arena thanks to grant from Emergency Services, the design will mean much of the patrol equipment can stay locked inside.

Surf Sports

It was great to see renewed passion for surf sports at our club with the Masters team competing at every level to Nationals. Congratulations on your sportsmanship and representing our club so well. Steve Team manager and Guy, Guru coach – fantastic results of which you and the team should be proud.

Mudjimba hosted the Sunshine Coast Branch surf lifesaving championships again this year giving our open and junior competitors a chance to shine on their home beach.

Youth and Junior Activities

As Queensland Youth Development club of the Year for 09/10 we have had a busy year once again. Our Yips crew participated in branch state and national leadership camps, and organized some of their own as well. They spent the weekend at Dickies' Beach and held our first YIPs camp and hosted at Elliot Heads SLSC members. Junior Activities at nippers training days continue to be a source of pride for the



club, with nippers obtaining awards, parents participating in the wider life of the club and surf skills increasing every week in an atmosphere well organized fun and inclusion. Sammy, Youth Officer and Damien, JAC Chairman your leadership and the passion and enthusiasm of your committees has shone though, thank you.

Off the Beach

I was particularly proud of the 11 members who acted as first responder crews for the boats we sent to Brisbane who worked in conjunction with the SES and fellow clubs during the floods. Guy Tanner was deservedly recognised with an Australia Day award in January for his work for Lifesaving on the Sunshine Coast. Our club members participated at ANZAC day services, community days with Parklakes, Pacific Paradise and Twin Waters, Race Days in Brisbane, Lions club events, Westpac's Chopper Challenge and fundraising for the Door Knock and Surf Safe appeal.

Ecosurf

Continuing with our involvement in Turtle Watch, members rescued two turtles this season who were transferred to Underwater World for rehabilitation and release. Tree day saw 900 trees planted in conjunction with 80 volunteers from the community. Work continued on accreditation for Ecobiz partner status including water reduction strategies, gas fittings and power saving devices being installed in the club house. Don your passion has guided the whole membership and is making a tangible impact on our club and communities wellbeing.

Sponsors

Once again a huge thank you to our generous sponsors for making it possible to provide patrols and service to our community in the 2010 -11 season and we look forward to working with you again next season.

Administration

MSLSC continues to employ a casual administrator to fulfil our reporting requirements for funding and assist in club activity as required. The audited financial reports are attached with this report, cash flow position is steady and debtors well controlled. Ownership and responsibility for the observation tower was transferred to the SCRC with an MOU of continued joint access. Funding from Grants and door knock appeals remain the primary income source for MSLSC with assistance from sponsors creating underlying sustainability of service. The goals set in the strategic plan are currently on track with member development, lifesaving and service. The incoming committee and administrator will have the opportunity to attend professional development at the annual conference in August 2011. We received registration as a provider of emergency services and completed compliance requirements for Youth and Child Protection Act registration. Nicky - Treasurer, Cath – Secretary, Dean - Club Captain and my Deputy President – Guy; without your support our club would not be in the great position it is, thank you.

Thank you again one and all – we have a fantastic club because of you!

What a season, as I read through my monthly reports there are few common themes that stand out, one is the weather that we experienced this season, it literally never stopped raining or blowing, some say the worst weather conditions in the history of the club, the conditions were so bad that the beach was closed a total of 47.5 hours, that's basically 10 patrols in total.

Secondly was the commitment made by the members, with 7574 patrolling hours logged we averaged 51 hours per patrol, this to me demonstrates the right stuff our club is made of, rain, hail or shine, you just kept showing up, no questions asked and for that I thank you.

I'm also pleased to report that we met our mission statement of "**Zero Preventable Deaths between the Flags**" we performed 1211 preventative actions and 106 rescues.

I would like to thank everyone for keeping our beach safe through this trying season. I need to particularly thank our Patrol Captains for their dedication to maintaining the highest level of surveillance, standards and patrol morel. Without your leadership qualities the Club wouldn't be able to set the high standard that it does.

Special mention should also be made to our Training Officers for their dedication to the countless hours of nurturing our newest members and bringing them into the Mudjimba team and up skilling existing members. This year saw a total of 149 new awards gained, which included 4 members gaining their Cert IV in Training and Assessing and 24 new bronze's, a big thank you to Toni Young, Guy Tanner and our club supervisor Gloria Ellis for your efforts in getting this large volume of training done throughout the season. Because of your dedication and commitment our Patrols are be some of the best qualified on the Coast.

A standout for me was observing the growth and development of our youth, their level of understanding and commitment amazes me, with a number of incidents during the season highlighting this; there is but one reason for this and I do not believe it is an accident that these young men and women are such outstanding people, it comes back to the leadership and mentoring from the senior members of the club "It takes a village to raise a child".

This season also saw us tasked to help out with the Brisbane floods; 11 of us went for those couple of days, I never thought that I'd have needed a street directory to drive an IRB and there was no mention of this when I was doing my driver training either.

Working closely with the SES and Police highlighted to me how professional we are, no matter what is thrown at us we can quickly adapt and get on with the job and work together for a good outcome.

It's been a pleasure and a privilege to be the Club Captain for the past two seasons, to be involved with such dedicated folk who work tirelessly to make our club the special place that it is something that I will cherish for the rest of my life, I cannot thank you all enough especially Kaitlyn our club president, your support has been fantastic.

Only a few of us really know the work load you carry and how professionally you are in carrying out your duties, thank you. "**Winners have parties and losers have meetings**", we have plenty to celebrate.

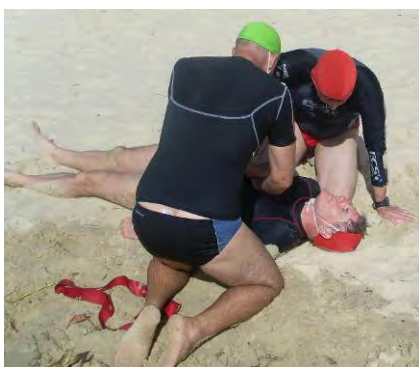

Officials Liaison

The 2010-11 surf sports season has seen a growth in our club's numbers of masters' competitors entering carnivals. This I believe is largely due to the efforts of Guy "guru" Peirce who is always on the scout to recruit new over 30 year olds who gain their bronze so be aware if he asks you how old you are, that is where it is going! Competition and in particular training does make for fitter life savers on our beach as well as being loads of fun if you have any kind of competitive streak in you.

With the increase in competitors comes a requirement for the club to provide officials to enable the carnivals to be run and so with this in mind I also did some recruiting and am pleased to advise that during this season we had six new officials attend the level 1 Surf Officials Course, which is a nationally recognised accreditation by the Australian Sports Commission. They are: Melanie Speechly, Sammy Burns, Kye Burke, Toni Young, Sandy Glass and Val Collie. Of the six new officials Mel, Toni and Sandy have already received their level 1 accreditation license. Sammy and Kye will also soon be accredited Level 1 as their paperwork is in process at present. Kye and Sammy specialise as Judge in Boat which is a much needed position at carnivals and one which you need to be a proficient IRB crewperson/or driver to do, so we are also extremely grateful to these two for performing that role.

Congratulations, and many thanks, to all our new officials for attending carnivals so our members can compete. We have between us all attended a wide range of carnivals ranging from Club and Branch carnivals to the Coolangatta Gold and the Australian Titles. From a Branch perspective we are also proud to have Mel, Kye and Sammy as the three youngest officials on the Sunshine Coast and possibly Queensland. Being an official is a way you can help the club if you are not a patrolling member but just want to help out, the only prerequisites are to be a minimum of 16 years of age, be a current financial member of the club, hold a current blue card and be willing to learn. The experience is often exciting, being in among the action of the carnival you get to see up close the competitors performing and also meet lots of other officials and competitors from other clubs. If anyone is interested in becoming a carnival official, our junior club in particular need officials, please contact me and I will be happy to answer any queries on what the role entails and how to go about learning to be an official.

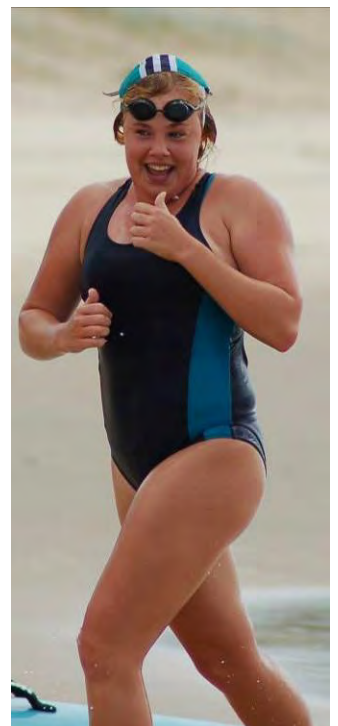
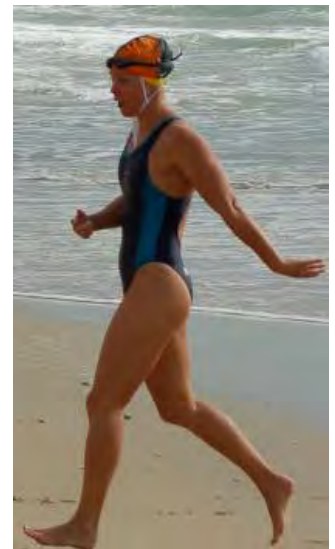

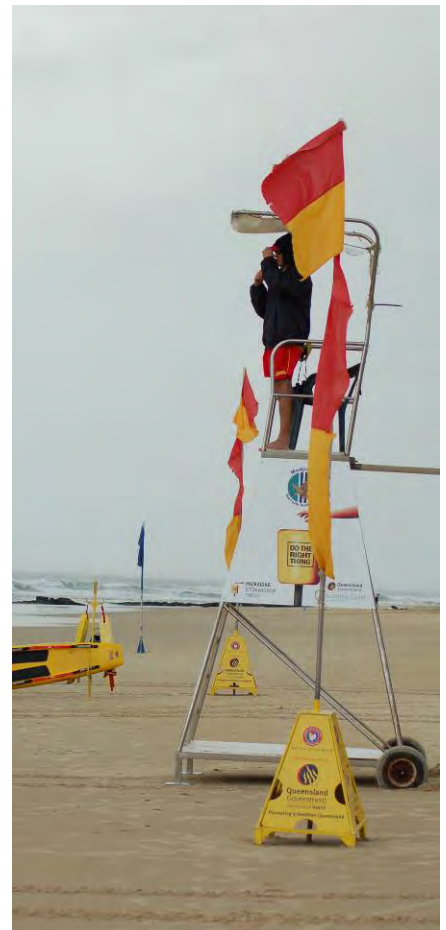

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL, 2011

Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

These financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis, are based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of the financial statements.

(a) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income and expenditure statement.

(d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(f) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(g) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(h) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.


