President's Report

9,315 hours, 256 awards, 41 rescues, 2,831 preventative actions

It has been a privilege to lead such a wonderful group of individuals. I am indebted to many of you who have made me look good, as no leadership position is a solo affair and it is your dedication and service that truly created such a strong and thriving club.

We have excelled in so many areas this year, not least of all our core business of lifesaving, as you read each officers report I am sure you will be amazed as I am that we have achieved so much in such a short time.



On the Beach

Nippers – Have had a very successful year, participating in carnivals to state level, growth in numbers and all positions filled. BBQs continued to assist with fundraising for new equipment and joint training particularly successful. The under 14s and cadets had a particularly good start to the year with camp at Rainbow, which I am sure will become an annual event.

Lifesaving

This season saw some major expenditure on new equipment with a new ATV, arena, boards, tubes, oxy and defibs and radios. Patrol numbers grew in strength and we proudly can claim positive member retention in all age groups against the organisations wider trends of falling numbers. A new patrol group 9 started and every patrol has multiple awards across most members giving us the best-qualified lifesavers on the beach. We trained over 40 new bronzes and SRC members and assisted in operations support across the branch, sharing our skills in training and assistance to other clubs. This commitment was recognised with nominations of several members for awards at State and National level.

Surf Sports

The success of our teams at Aussies, State Branch and Lifesaving carnivals brought home a swag of medals, smiles and pride in the navy and teal. GO MUDJIMBA was heard over the sand up and down the coast all season. We hosted the branch lifesaving championships at our beach and if the stories are true are already in prep for the World titles! Our masters went from strength to strength and often seen pounding the sand and punched above our weight again and again – good mates and good sports all round.

Off the Beach

Our administration team have worked hard to deliver strong financial results with the club in a positive position for the future and secure funding to provide services. Maintenance and improvements to the building and fixtures included painting, plumbing, training equipment, locks and programs. Some capital expenditure will be required to consolidate these improvements and accommodate the clubs growth in the future. The big news was securing the lease on the clubhouse lot which secures our building for the future at a fixed rate. We won several major grants and enjoyed sponsorship from existing and new partners. Our administrator's hours were increased in line with increased workload from membership growth. Proudly we continued to play a prominent role in the Mudjimba community, partnering with the Lions Club, RSL, Art Group, Youth Groups, Jetski Club, residents associations and recently board riders club in various capacities from provision of space to support at community events like Christmas Carols and Anzac Day. Proudly we continued partnerships with Coast Care and Turtle Watch through our Ecosurf program and championed the Bins on the Beach initiative to encourage personal responsibility for our precious beach environment and a sustainable future for all our members.

The Club continues to work on a user pays principle for Surf Sports and Junior Development activities. I commend the Nippers and YIPs for their fundraising activities that allow them to self-fund their plans and camps. I welcome any Members' ideas for fundraising and sponsorship of individual events and competitions, with the Club again this year meeting half costs for developmental branch and state camps. The financial reality of our Club is that all resources need to be prioritised towards the Beach and our Lifesaving requirements and financial assistance isn't as possible as it is in other Clubs. The season wrap up from the training department....here goes!

What a massive season we've had, with MASSIVE changes to the way both proficiencies and courses are run plus a brand new award in Advanced Resuscitation Techniques the pre-season and season it's self was full of challenges and a new learning curve for everyone. We as a club have had a truck load of new awards and new members as well as upgrade of existing Bronze members and SRC members it hard to remember where we started and if we're actually finished yet!

Beginning of season 2011/12 saw an IRB Drivers course which was very interesting as it was not typical winter weather and was a little testing but all got through unscathed I think!? Then our proficiencies started, and what beautiful weather we had for all of them! With the help of our club assessors we put through 76 Bronze proficiencies, 24 First Aid plus 41 IRB Crew and 23 IRB Drivers were run through the Branch run IRB Proficiency program. All up we had a gargantuan effort of 239 awards made proficient across our membership base. GO MUDJIMBA!!



There were a lot of members new and old who gained new awards this season; all up we had 266 awards gained across various disciplines, some of which include:

- 39 new bronze medallion holders
- 23 new SRC members
- 38 Advanced Resuscitation Techniques

Although the season is over we have a busy off season ahead. With First Aid, ART, IRB crew, IRB drivers and Bronze/SRC courses all about to start and be completed prior to next season starting.

2011 / 2012 Mudjie Nippers Carnival Crew – Swanny Speak

This season we saw a magnificent increase to our clubs nipper participation at carnivals. This included not only the kids rocking up to compete but some serious commitments to extra training across early mornings, afternoons and weekends.

From a representation point of view this year Mudjimba Juniors shined bright. It was a huge delight for all involved to see such a solid representation of the navy, teal and white thick amongst the competition. It is with absolute honesty (No BS) that I say that one more than one occasion I had several coaches, officials and water safety from other clubs tell me that the greatest smiles amongst all clubs came from Mudjimba.



My greatest pride this year came from our clubs team spirit across all age groups at every carnival and every training session. We have a long way to go in competition but the way the kids rally around each other, celebrate everyone's participation and stick tight as a club unit sets standards well beyond their young years. I have said it much this season but we all have a lot to be very proud of with our Nippers.

On an endeavour front we had no competition. The grit and determination of the kids was awesome. This is reflected in the extra hours our kids put into training over and above their Sunday's. We did "full on" sprint sessions at 6.30am Friday mornings, Flag and swim / board training on Wednesday's and threw in a couple of Saturday sessions. In total our kids trained an **extra 501 hours across 28 training sessions**. That is on average 15-20 kids at every session – Brilliant.

Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the IncomeTax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

(d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(f) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(g) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(h) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are

(i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.
