## Treasurer

2012/2013 represented my first full year as Treasurer and I gained a much greater understanding of how the Club's income and expenses "fit" together. As a Club we continue to prioritise our financial responsibilities first towards the Beach and its requirements to equipment and training.

Income was reduced from the previous year in most categories however as major Grants and Sponsorships (RSL) in 2011/2012 to purchase specific assets were not awarded in 2012/2013, this does distort the comparison. Our operational costs are met by the SLS Operational Subsidy which was unchanged from 2011/2012 and our Membership fees. The majority of other expenses are met on a "user pays" principal or with specific fundraising activities allocated to specific activities (such as the Rainbow Camp and other Youth camps). The Club cash profit (before depreciation on equipment) was spent entirely on new equipment which has meant we have not increased our CASH position as in previous years. The establishment of new income sources will be a focus of the new Management Committee in 2013/2014.

We rely on the awarding of Grants, participation of members in fundraising events and on wonderful donations from various members of our Community to fund our capital and asset purchases.

### Grants

This year we received approval for 2 grants only despite applying for more funds.

As the Club performed excellently in its core activities of Beachgoer protection and Lifesaver training during another tough year and we remain able to meet our financial commitments as they fall due, in my opinion as Treasurer – it was a successful year. Thank you everyone (particularly Val) for your assistance.

Both ladies are nipper parents and I am sure the nipper committee would also join in thanking them for their efforts so that the Mudjimba nippers are able to send competitors to carnivals. 1 official for every ten competitors is required in order for the club to compete so without the officials the club could not send competitors along to carnivals.

Each year the Branch runs courses for new officials very early after the season starts. Information about these courses is sent to clubs prior to the season starting. If anyone is interested in becoming an official they should contact the Club Official's Liaison Officer or Surf Sports Officer for information.

## Junior Activities (Nippers)

This season we had 145 enrolled nippers for our 2012/2013 program.

This being said our Mudjimba nippers still rock n rolled through a revised program (including walking up the beach 1-2kms to find sand between the rocks) battling whatever Mother Nature threw at us often with significant numbers of kids in dreadful weather.

As usual the season started off in September school holidays with 12 new SRC (U14's) and 4 Bronzies heading to Rainbow Beach for a week under the guidance of Dean, Iarline and the Mudjimba road crew. This then followed into the season with another 7 going through their SRC over the first 10 weeks of our program. This has proved to be an invaluable strategy and contribution to the numbers of orange in the water at nippers but most importantly injecting young, fun and motivated mentors into our extended programs – congratulations and thank you to all of you U14's and extended Juniors / Cadets that stood up and contributed to the clubs JAC programs this season – it literally would not happen without you.

Our program this year, under the direction of a very young (in club terms) JAC Committee saw some significant changes to our points system which leads into Club Champs and the new Surf Sports Champs. By all accounts this proved to be amazingly successful. Our JAC Club Champs day was a huge success due mostly to the good luck of one amazing Sunday in between 10 weeks of horrid weather. From an awards perspective our revised structure of using Attendance, Age Manager Assessments and Peer vote for our respective age champions saw awards being presented at the end of season to a very diverse group of kids from U8 – U14.

Congratulations must go to Lachlan McKenna and Artatia O'Connor both U13's for being crowned as our clubs Overall Junior Club Champions.

HUGE thanks go to the JAC Committee and extended JAC family. We tackled some big adversity this year with conditions etc but as a group we achieved some amazing things. The commitment to support ongoing fundraising for the purchase of our brand new 10 x Hayden boards and our now inaugural Nippers Disco was a blast. Special thanks to my big mate Adam Amos who approached the pack up each Sunday like a machine and overlaid his soft and gentle touch on everything we did. Equally for tagging in on the JAC Chairperson role for next season – we are looking good for 2013/2014.

To all of you that at some point throughout the season threw your hand to help – in particular those that wore the illustrious orange cap – THANK YOU. There are so many rewards that come from this I know but as I have stated prior, this Nippers program does not run at all without the generous, kind and eager support of our clubbies young and old. ## Surf Sports – Carnivals

Our improvement primarily was on the sand with pretty much every relay team making finals at Branch and many (most) of our kids making finals in sprints or final 8 in flags. Adam and I will be looking at opportunities to improve our water based development in the following season but our efforts this season genuinely reaped rewards for those that dedicated themselves to training.

By far one of the greatest things that came from our competition season was the introduction of Lindsay Macdonald-Clow (Lindz) to the group. Mate, you are a dead set champion. Your commitment to additional training (all of them but 2 for the entire season) and every Carnival is awesome. 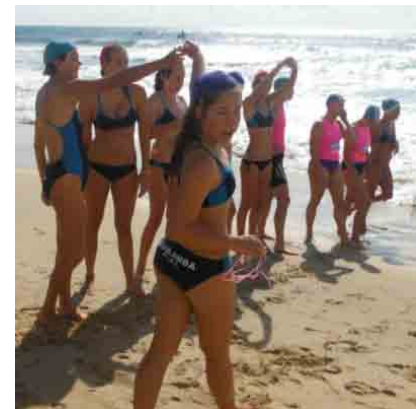

**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2013**

**Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Queensland). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

**(a) Income Tax**

The Club is exempt from income tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

**(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

**(c) Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

**(d) Employee Benefits**

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

**(e) Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

**(f) Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

**(g) Accounts receivable and other debtors**

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

**(h) Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2013**

**(i) Leases**

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

**(j) Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

**(k) Accounts payable and other payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
