

The 2015/16 season has been another huge year for our little club. Sometimes I do not know how we get everything done, but somehow it seems to fall into place or at least mostly into place. Our club literally runs on the smell of an oily rag; we only have one paid employee who tells me she only does 9 hours a week. Everything else that we do at Mudjimba is done voluntarily. We do it, because we love what we do. There is no other club like us on the Sunshine Coast.

Congratulations and sincere thanks to our 212 volunteer patrolling members who completed 10404 patrol and water safety hours, performed 92 rescues and 1095 preventable actions and in the process have once again kept our fellow beach users safe.

Thanks to our trainers who helped get our competitors ready. Mudjimba can also be proud of the fantastic youth we have coming through our club. These young members will hopefully go on to be the next generation of lifesavers.

Steve Smith – Surf Sports Director, Door Knock Coordinator and official referee for Club Champs day. Steve always encourages our masters and junior competitors to reach new milestones in the surf sports arena.

Adam Amos – our JAC Coordinator. has done a great job this season continuing to share his passion for developing surf skills in our younger members. It was Adams idea to introduce the Under 6 and Under 7 year olds to our nipper program and I think it has been a huge success.

To our club administrator Val Colley I do not know if everyone realises just how much work Val does for our club. Val is fastidious in keeping our records up to date and alerting me to issues that needed attention. Our club would probably come to a standstill without her. I would also like to thank my wife Janine and my kids for letting me take on the role of President.

This September the 21st will mark the 20th anniversary of the first Mudjimba patrol on Mudjimba Beach. That patrol was made up of 3 people Mark Windsor / Club Captain, Beau Dapra and Jason Trillo. When they started patrols in 1996 our club had only 19 active members who were spread out across 6 patrols and no clubhouse. Thankfully by the end of the season the club had grown to 36 active members. These 36 members patrolled around 2600 hours that season averaging 72 hours per patrolling member.

Mark Windsor patrolled 182 hours, Dave Johnston 183, Laurie Satori 226 and Michael Lawrence 316 hours that first season. Our first members put in an amazing effort and I think it was because of that effort and commitment they laid the foundation of the culture we have at our club today.

I am very optimistic about the future of our club, our membership increased to 479 members and we are on the brink of securing more land around our clubhouse which should be finalised by August 2016. This land acquisition will play a pivotal role in the future development of our club and will be the catalyst for extensive club and community consultation, as we work out, what we need to do to secure our clubs future while at the same time respecting our clubs past.

Whatever, our future clubhouse development may look like, I hope that we never lose the culture that our club was built on, the passion our club was built with and the generosity, compassion and enthusiasm that our members have always had.

Morning swims, nippers and things, patrolling and providing, Good times to rememba.





Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Queensland). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(a) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the IncomeTax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

(d) Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(f) Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(g) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(h) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

(i) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(j) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

(k) Accounts payable and other payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
